#### Beyond One Language: Embracing Translanguaging to Empower Student Voices

How and why do bi/multilinguals use translanguaging? While translanguaging has been posited as a promising pedagogical practice, many educators don't treat it as a legitimate asset to be leveraged during teaching and learning. We will present results of a study that analyzed translingual student writing to understand the use of translanguaging through a systemic functional linguistics lens. Participants will engage in their own analysis of writing and discuss implications. We will conclude with specific recommendations for the intentional use of translanguaging in teaching and learning.

#### **Building Inclusive Opportunities for Multilingual Early-Educational Workforce in California**

This mixed-methods case study examined how California's higher education supports the multilingual early-learning workforce. A website analysis of course offerings assessed the impact of language policies and societal shifts on multilingualism. Interviews with six faculty members revealed how faculty practices, motivations, and institutional structures developed multilingual pathways. Thematic analysis highlighted challenges such as limited resources and administrative support, alongside faculty innovation, community partnerships, and a shared commitment to equity and linguistic inclusion.

#### Metalinguistics: The Common Thread and Missing Piece in Biliteracy Instruction

Metalinguistic knowledge development is the common thread underlying literacy learning in two languages in biliteracy programs. Emergent bilingual readers go through stages of cognitive insights into how written languages work. Explicit teaching of language subsystems supports students' decoding and meaning-construction processes. The presenter models a step-by-step lesson planning process based on the Common Core en Español Standards and correlated with a Metalinguistic Knowledge Development Continuum.

The US Department of Education's Office of English Language Acquisition awarded Hamline University a \$1.4 million National Professional Development grant in 2016 to support the English Learners in the Mainstream (ELM) Project. Throughout the grant's six-year duration, 402 ELM coaches received training. The model, now called School-Wide English Learning (SWEL), has found implementation in schools across the nation with close to 400 SWEL coaches trained to date. SWEL offers a framework that enables school systems to integrate comprehensive support for multilingual learners of English throughout the entire school day.

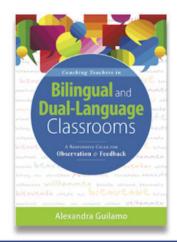

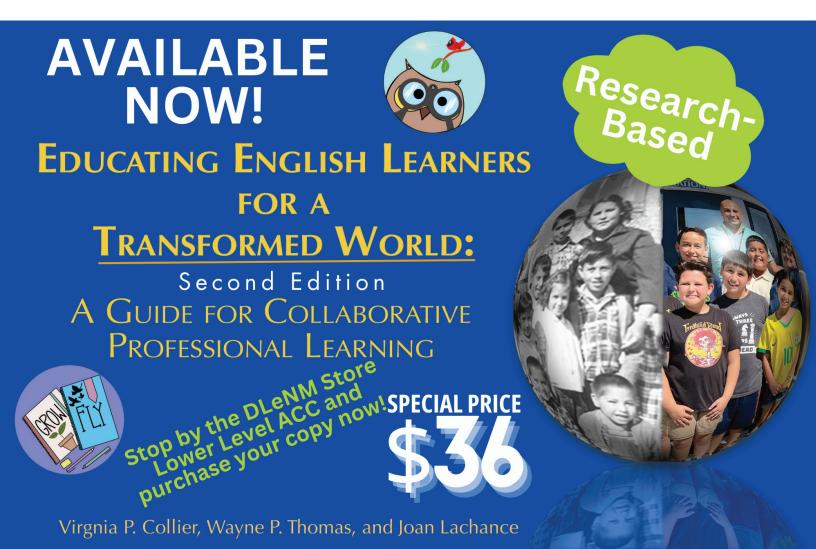
