On behalf of the New Mexico Tribal Language Consortium (NMTLC), welcome to *La Cosecha Dual Language Conference 2025*!

NMTLC is a dynamic grassroots organization consisting of members that are dedicated to empowering Indigenous language initiatives across New Mexico! As you step onto these lands, home to our peoples for millennia, we wish to share important facts about our respective Indigenous languages.

Within the state of New Mexico there are **eight distinctive Indigenous language** families that are still spoken: **Apache** (spoken by Jicarilla, Mescalero and Fort Sill Apache tribes); **Keres** (spoken by the Pueblos of Acoma, Laguna, Santa Ana, San Felipe, Zia, Cochiti and Santo Domingo); **Diné Bizaad** (spoken by Navajo Nation); **Tiwa** (spoken by the Pueblos of Taos, Picuris, Sandia and Isleta); **Tewa** (spoken by Ohkay Owingeh, the Pueblos of Santa Clara, San Ildefonso, Nambe, Pojoaque and Tesuque); **Towa** (spoken by the Pueblo of Jemez); and **Zuni** (spoken by the Pueblo of Zuni). The City of Albuquerque exists on the lands of the Tiwa speaking people, specifically the Pueblos of Sandia and Isleta. Albuquerque is home to a vibrant inter-tribal community that includes many Pueblo, Diné, Apache and other Indigenous peoples.

Our languages are truly unique, deeply rooted in oral traditions, and intricately connected to our lands. This year's conference theme, "Rooted in Solidarity: Celebrating 30 Years of Community, Language, and Culture," acknowledges that our ancestral languages are spoken and give life in return, allowing us to gain the strength to understand and appreciate our connections to all living beings. It allows us to live by the Creator's guiding principles for living a life of balance, harmony and well-being. It promotes health and good relations with all things on Mother Earth and Father Sky.

We are happy that you are here to collaborate and share essential knowledge and expertise with those who value the heartwork we do for our languages. With gratitude and respect,



Leveraging Students' Whole Linguistic Repertoires to Enhance their Bilingualism and Biliteracy Development

This session will provide participants working in Spanish-English dual language programs with the opportunity to enhance their pedagogical language knowledge by examining similarities and differences between Spanish and English as they relate to:

- Pragmatics (language use at the discourse level)
- Syntax (sentence structure)
- Morphology and the lexicon (word parts and vocabulary)
- Phonology and orthography (sound-letter correspondences)

At the end of the session, participants will be able to: 1) identify systems and structures of Spanish and English; and 2) use methods for teaching similarities and differences between the two languages that promote students' metalinguistic awareness. Practical classroom-based instructional strategies and opportunities to put them into practice will be embedded throughout the session.

Dual language teachers are expected to provide language arts instruction through both program languages, but they aren't given twice as much time to do it. Using a four-step process for cross-linguistic co-planning, English and partner-language teachers can work together to identify what needs to be taught in each language, what can be distributed across the two languages, and how to help students make cross-linguistic connections either way. Participants will leave the session with practical tools and strategies to support biliteracy mapping and cross-linguistic co-planning in the other content areas.



a variety of mediums. Of Piro Pueblo and Spanish descent, LeFebre




devoted following for his silver jewelry, Pueblo belt weavings, and moccasins.

Tonio's paintings have been chosen to represent various events and organizations, including the Pueblo Latino Chamber of Commerce and La Cosecha, the national conference on language and educational equity. His murals can be viewed at the Pueblo Heritage Museum and along the West 18th Street Bridge in Pueblo, Colorado.





In describing his painting "Rooted," created for La Cosecha 2025, LeFebre writes:



"Rooted' is a painting rich in color and detail, depicting a celebration. The community has come together to witness the liberation of language held within the confines of its scholastic rule. The piñata, used here as a symbol of culture and knowledge, is opened by our future generations, spewing out a gift of language for all to enjoy, share, and expand without a toll. Surrounding the celebration is a wall symbolizing boundary—it has a gateway that leads out to a vast openness of opportunity. Other subjects of significance are the dog in the foreground, representing loyalty, and the proportionally correct, *30-year-old cottonwood tree with its leaves,* symbolizing language as they sing in the wind, and its root system—appreciated by many cultures for its ability to seek out water sources for sustenance creating a strong foundation for its existence."
